LEWIS COUNTY DEMOCRATIC CENTRAL COMMITTEE OPPOSES ELIMINATING BLANKET PRIMARY

At the January meeting of the Lewis County Democratic Central Committee meeting held at King Solomon's Restaurant the PCOs present took a stand in opposition to eliminating Washington's long-time Both the Washington State blanket primaries. Democratic and Republican State Central Committees have been trying to gain elimination of the existing Washington State primary election system in an effort to strengthen the role of the state parties in selecting candidates who run under their respective party labels. They won a favorable Supreme Court decision that held blanket primaries violated the rights of the political parties. As a result of that law suit the Washington State legislature is now considering options for changing our state's primary election laws.

Blanket primaries are primary elections in

which voters need not declare a party affiliation to vote in the selection of party nominees, and allows individuals to cross party lines for the purpose of voting for individuals who they believe are the best persons to fill the office being sought. Washington is one of only a hand full of states that allow blanket primary elections.

Washington legislators are considering a number of options for dealing with the primary election question. Word has it that among those options are going to completely closed primaries, eliminating state funded primary elections and going to a Louisiana style primary election. The Louisiana style primary involves all candidates, regardless of party affiliation, running against one another with the top two vote getters (regardless of their political party) facing each other in the general election.

The position taken by the two state-wide political parties has generated a great deal of controversy. Elected legislators and news media have been the most outspoken in opposition to eliminating the blanket primary.

The Lewis County Democratic Central Committee put its hat in the ring in opposition to its own state party on January 25, 2001, when it passed the following resolution which was proposed by Eugene Butler, PCO for the Berwick Precinct. State Committee Woman Cat Underhill reports that Democratic Central Committees in Clark County and Whatcom Counties have also expressed strong opposition to eliminating the blanket primary.

Lewis County Democratic Central Committee Resolution for the Blanket Primary

"WHEREAS:

For more than 60 years the people of the State of Washington have enjoyed the freedom of participation in the process of selecting candidates for public office through the blanket primary system.

This process came to us through a vote of the people and has encouraged all people to feel they have a significant role in the selection of good candidates for public office.

The Democratic Party has a long tradition of being a party of inclusion of people with many points of view.

Encouraging people, who may otherwise not participate at all in a strictly partisan atmosphere, to continue to participate on a blanket basis is in the interest of the people of the State of Washington and of the Democratic Party.

The decision of the conservative members of the Supreme Court of the United States to deprive people of their right to choose is not in the interest of the people or the Democratic Party.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Democratic Party seek a legislative solution with the following characteristics:

That a blanket primary remain the method for candidate selection in all elections conducted at public expense.

That any political party that wishes to restrict the election process in any manner that requires a voter to choose from only its candidates must pay the cost incurred for the election.

That any political party that decides to deprive the people of this state from participating in the popular election process may select their candidates by convention."

Lewis County Central Committee Chair Deanna Zieske has forwarded this resolution to the Washington State Democratic Party. She stated that she hopes that the resolution will be on the agenda for action at the next Washington State Democratic Central Committee meeting.


